FUN Fact

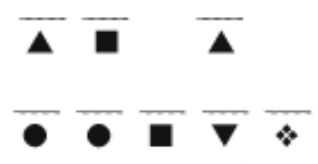

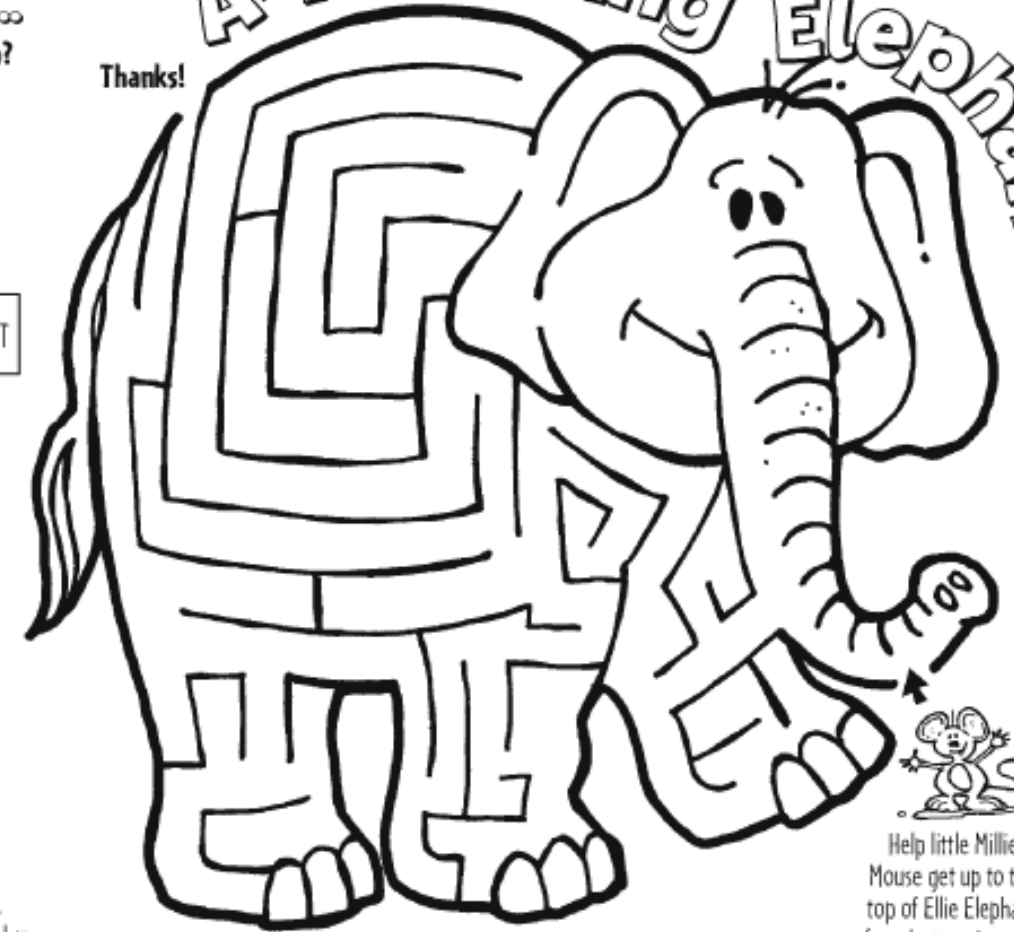

A-MAZE-ing Elephant!



The elephant is the heaviest land animal, but moves around almost silently. They have soft, elastic pads on their feet that muffle their footsteps.

Help little Millie Mouse get up to the top of Ellie Elephant for a better view and quiet ride.

That's FAST (Air-Land-Sea)

It is said that one of the fastest animals is the **spine-tailed swift**. This bird has been clocked to fly at 106 miles per hour, and can fly 560 miles a day. wow.

In the sea... the **sailfish** with its' crescent-shaped tail is ideal for pushing smoothly through the water at 68 miles per hour.. now that's something to splash about.

On land, **cheetahs** have been clocked at 50 miles per hour, but they can only keep it up for about 440 yards, then need to catch their breath. Their claws act like spikes on running shoes, and give good grip and quick turns.
